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ABSTRACT: The abstract section consists of the purpose of writing, the subject of the study, and the results or conclusions. This section contains 50-75 words, single typed spaces, Times New Roman with size 10/11 font.

Keywords: Keywords describe the main research problem, containing 3-5 words either single word or phrase, referring to the word in the title or implied in the discussion. Typed single space, Times New Roman with size 10/11 font.

INTRODUCTION

The introductory section contains (a) the background or reason why "x" is examined (2-3 most important), (b) the main theory, (c) the relevant previous study, and (d) an end to the statement of purpose of writing. In the introduction, there must be relevant references. In the introduction there is no need for separate theories or library studies or subheadings. The length of the introductory section is about 25% of the total number of article pages. Typed space 1.5, Times New Roman with size 12 font.

DISCUSSION

The discussion contains the answers to the problem/purpose of article writing, explanation of important points in the sub-subtopics. Sub-subtopics are elaborated. The points of discussion correspond to the title and purpose of the

writing. Subtitle writing is according to sub-subtopics. This section uses relevant, up-to-date, and primary referrals that come with the usual reference notes. This section is presented in the form of a communicative essay with varied sentences. The length of this section is about 65% of the total number of article pages. Typed space 1.5, Times New Roman with size 12 font.

CONCLUSION

The conclusion is not a summary, but solid statements containing inferences based on the core. The length of the core is about 10% of the total number of article pages. This section becomes the subheading expressed in the conclusion paragraph. Typed space 1.5, Times New Roman with size 12 font.

REFERENCES

The sources quoted should be on the reference list, and the sources on the reference list must be completely quoted. References should be from the past 10 years. At minimum, it contains to a national journal and reference to a current international journals. Typed space 1.5, Times New Roman with size 12 font. Writing a bibliography using the format of the American Psychological Association (APA)
